

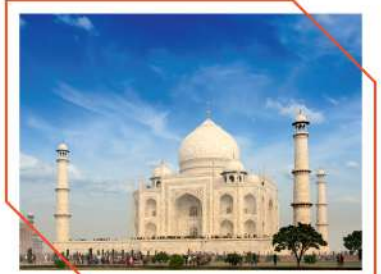
Taj Mahal set to reopen on September 21

India's iconic Taj Mahal and Red Fort in Agra are all set to reopen on September 21, after being closed for over six months.

All centrally protected monuments closed their doors on March 17 before the nationwide lockdown and dramatic spread of Covid-19 in the country. There will be a cap of 5,000 on the number of visitors allowed per day. "Masks are mandatory to enter the monuments and all tickets must be purchased online. Ticket counters won't open," said Vasant Swarnkar, Superintending Archaeologist of the Archaeological Survey of India's Agra Circle. Tickets will be sold online or through the ASI phone app.

Visitors will be required to follow all guidelines issued by the Central Government such as social distancing and hand sanitisation.

Bengaluru to get a new Amusement Park



Residents of the tech capital could soon have a new tourist destination closer home as the state government plans to set up an amusement park near Manchanabele Dam in Ramanagara district.

The irrigation department has proposed to develop the land close to the picturesque dam, which is about 37km from Bengaluru as a tourism hub on a public private partnership model. "We have earmarked Rs 150 crore to develop the new amusement park as part of the government's plans to develop Ramanagara district as a tourism hub," said deputy chief minister CN Ashwath Narayan, who is also in charge of the district. "If developed, it will become a major tourist place in the region and since it will be close to Bengaluru, it will become a popular destination."

A garden on the lines of Brindavan Garden at Krishnarajasagaradam in Mandya will also be developed at Manchanabele. The proposal includes beautification of Manchanabele dam through illumination. "There will be a special type of architectural and aesthetical object-based lighting effect to enhance the beauty of the dam," an official said.

Disneyland could reopen under California's 4-tier plan

Disneyland and Disney California Adventure could reopen in stages under California's new COVID-19 four-tier plan that allows the state's businesses to return with outdoor-only operations followed by reduced capacity for indoor services. California theme parks closed in mid-March amid the COVID-19 pandemic and remain shuttered indefinitely while they await state guidelines for safely reopening. Theme parks were not included in the business sector guidance list released by California Gov. Gavin Newsom's office that detailed a new four-tier system taking effect Monday, Aug. 31. The revised Blueprint for a Safer Economy lays out criteria for loosening and tightening COVID-19 restrictions in California counties.
